

Landscaping questions?

Numerous questions arisen regarding rear yard and corner landscaping:

In accordance with the Design Guidelines: Side and Rear Yard Landscape-

"Side and rear yard landscaping shall provide a natural transition between the Lot and its surroundings. Owners of Lots shall landscape and maintain their yards in a neat and orderly fashion."

"Owners are responsible for landscaping and maintaining the area behind the curb to their property line, unless that area is in a District Area. (This also means weed maintenance on corners); please refer to exhibits 14,15.17, and 18 in the Design Guidelines for clarification."

Please remember there are minimum requirements for the front yard. Please review the Design Guidelines sections 5.2 in DRC no 1 and section 6.2 in DRC no 2.

WEEDS, WEEDS, and More WEEDS!

Noxious Weed Alert -





Canada Thistle

Mullein

Please check your property for the above noxious weeds (Noxious weeds are flowers/plants that are not native to Colorado) these plants need to be removed.

Canada Thistle can be removed by using "Roundup"; let the seeds/plant heads die and remove. Mullein can be removed simply by pulling it from the root. You will need to do this prior to it blooming so the seeds do not spread.

Other weeds:

Please check your lawns for broadleaf weeds and spray. The seeds from other weeds have taken root and have been seen in the rocked areas, please be sure to spray and remove them.

Quick reminder on landscape improvements and front yards from the Design Guidelines for Stonebridge community. Section 6.2 outlines the REQUIREMENTS for each lot. Each Lot shall have the minimum number of trees and shrubs in the front yard as outlined below:

Minimum # of trees

3

*For corner lots, a minimum of 4 trees are required.

Minimum # of shrubs

10-1 gallon and 5-5 gallon

Trees recommended for planting within the landscape strip include Hackberry, Amur Maple or Tatarian Maple. Acceptable materials for the landscape strip include turf, xeriscape, rock mulch or landscaping that would complement the front yard.

NOTE: Under NO circumstances will planting of pine trees or willow trees be allowed in the landscape strip.




St. Jude Dream Home® Winner Announced


Pre-swim Requires:

- "Swim-Tread-Swim Sequence"
- 150 Freestyle or
 Breaststroke --> 2
 minute tread with no
 hands --> 50 Freestyle
 or Breaststroke
 (No Breaks)
- Retrieving object timed event



Cost for the class is \$300. Employment at the Meridian Ranch Recreation Center can be discussed after successfully passing the pre-swim. Certification will be covered for those who are hired at the MRRC.

We strive to bring you a variety of high quality classes at MRRC.

Our trained and certified staff will do everything possible to meet your needs and exceed your expectations.

We ask that you carefully read this information and follow all guidelines.

- We value our members and instructors time; therefore we ask all members to arrive on time for class to ensure proper set up and limit disruptions once class has begun.
 - If you are more than 10 minutes late, we ask that you please attend the next available class, as entry will not be permitted.
- Participants must register either online, or check-in at the front desk for classes.
- · Appropriate clothing and footwear is required for class.
- In an effort to extend the life of our studios, we ask that no food or drink other than bottled water be brought into the studios.
- In order to prolong the life of our equipment and for sanitation purposes, we require all class participants to clean and disinfect equipment after use. Paper towels and sanitizing wipes are provided in each studio.
- The studios are specifically for scheduled classes and/or programs; any other use of the studios must be approved by and scheduled through the group fitness director/rec center manager.
- Children ages 13 and up may participate in group fitness classes with a parent/guardian 18 or older. Ages 15 and up may participate without adult supervision.

These policies are meant to ensure that classes run on schedule and in a safe manner. We value your safety as well as the classes safety!
